Camping/Caravanning/Motorcaravanning

Before taking an Easter break, it is a good idea to check that you have the most important **basic equipment in your caravan/motorcaravan,** the following items having always proved to be indispensable:

Camping guide – drive-on wedges – CEE adapter jacks, CEE adapter plugs, camping table and chairs, first-aid box, fresh water hose, gaffer tape, gas bottles, watering can, cable drum/reel for outdoor use, sanitary additive for the toilet, stormband for awnings, flashlight/head torch, warning triangle, warning sign for bike carriers (for Italy and Spain), high visibility vests (1 per passenger), washing line, spirit level, tool kit, extra rear-view mirror for towing vehicle and don't forget toilet paper, paper napkins and kitchen roll.

The Caravansalon 2024 in **Wels/Austria** with its range of leisure vehicles attracted a record number of 230 exhibitors and over 45,000 enthusiastic camping fans thereby confirming the continuing boom in the camping business. In Austria, like everywhere else.

Over 220,000 new registrations: European caravanning market remains at a high level

Caravanning continues to enjoy great popularity throughout Europe. In 2024, more leisure vehicles were registered across Europe than in the previous year representing a growth of around 5.2%.

Germany is by far the largest caravanning market in Europe and once again accounted for the largest share of new registrations with 96,392 units. France, the second largest market in Europe, reported 33,783 new registrations, an increase of 7.6% compared to the previous year. The number of new registrations in the United Kingdom also rose to a total of around 28,011 units (+10.4%), significantly exceeding the 2023 level.

Motor caravan registrations up, caravan segment remains stable

This segment recorded a total of 160,467 new registrations, Germany, the largest market, contributing 74,718 new registrations (+ 9.1%). France followed with 26,396 new registrations (+ 10.3%), the United Kingdom registered 16,567 units (+ 36%).

The caravan segment recorded a total of 60,865 new registrations (- 4.7%) of which Germany accounted for 21,674 new caravans (-1%), the United Kingdom 11,400 units (approx. -13%) whereas the Netherlands with 7,192 caravans recorded an increase of 6.1%.

At the beginning of December, 59% of **motorcaravans** were in winter storage, the remainder were either spending the winter parked at home or on the road (being used).

Heavy motorcaravans with a trailer (over 7,500 kg) should (or at a future date will be obliged to) have a tachograph (trip recorder) fitted because, according to the Environment and Traffic Inspectorate (ILT), motorcaravans could come under the heading of freight traffic for which a tachograph is obligatory if the maximum authorised mass is greater than 7,500 kg. However this regulation, based on an EU directive dating back to 2006, has been "a dead letter" until now. In case of doubt, seek advice from your national Ministry of Transport.

Burglaries in caravans and motorcaravans

Everyone knows that thieves like to operate when all is quiet, and they will certainly keep away if there is lighting and a lot of noise.

Here are a few anti-theft tips:

- ° Special plates can be purchased in specialist shops and fixed on the inside of the door to prevent anyone from cutting their way through the entrance door and lock fitting.
- ° If your caravan or motorcaravan is fitted with an alarm, display a warning sticker.
- ° A sticker showing a dog can frighten off a burglar, as can a large food bowl next to the door!
- ° Conceal an obsolete phone in your caravan or motorcaravan with the most useful contacts and important phone numbers.
- ° Consider installing a manual transmission lock or use a steering wheel lock or wheel clamp.
- ° Change the codes on your alarm system and entrance door regularly.
- ° Thieves usually go through the living space first of all. Make sure there are no valuables lying around and turn the chairs round with their backs towards the door.
- ° Spend the night near other campers and avoid camping next to or between parked trucks.

° Sign up to a reliable caravan or motorcaravan camping insurance with good coverage. Check whether there is a discount on the insurance premium if you install anti-theft devices.

Practical tips - useful for campers too

Do not leave fruit anywhere near **cut flowers** because the ripening gas emitted by fruit causes flowers to wilt more quickly.

Wooden spoons can be kept clean by dissolving a packet of baking soda in 500 ml of hot water. Leave the spoons to soak for four hours and germs and bacteria will disappear as will any stains.

Piece of advice

Anyone who is thinking of buying a new mobile/smartphone, should wait until 20 June 2025 before doing so, because on that date a new ecodesign directive comes into force in the EU. From then on all spare parts and repair information for cameras, batteries and cables must be made available for at least seven years. Mobile phones must be resistant to dust particles, water splashes and being dropped. In addition manufacturers must provide OS and security updates free of charge for five years.

The EU ecodesign directive will ensure products are environmentally-friendly and focus on repairability, durability, upgradeability and recyclability.

MISCELLANEOUS

Traffic

Germany: In 2023, there were 282,000 reported cases of drivers colliding with wild animals –numbers are rising.

The Gotthard Tunnel (between Switzerland and Italy), the Mont Blanc Tunnel (between France and Italy) and the Brenner Pass (between Austria and Italy) are all due for maintenance work and will therefore be partly closed or reduced to one lane for through traffic. The Brenner Pass (A13) introduced a 60 km/h maximum speed limit on 1 January 2025 because of upgrading the Luegbrücke (construction of a new bridge) that is due to last until 2030.

France: In France increasing numbers of speed cameras have been installed (four thousand) and at least 500 radar cameras to check that the distance between vehicles complies with regulations, that speed limits are being respected, that drivers do not go through red lights or use their phone while driving etc. etc. Fines can be as much as 540€.

Health

Our bodies need **magnesium** in the winter months to keep our muscles and bones healthy. This mineral supports nerve function and is also partly responsible for regulating body temperature. Pharmacies sell magnesium supplement pills but nuts, pulses/legumes and green leafy vegetables are also a rich source of magnesium and readily available.

Germany has designated the linden tree (aka lime tree) as **medicinal plant of the year.** This tree can live to be 1,000 years old and tea made from its flowers is an expectorant, sudorific (induces sweat), calms coughs and relieves stress.

Curious facts/Environment/Culture

Henry Ford (1863-1947) had the idea that his workers and office staff should not work at weekends so that they could have two extra days to spend in their cars – a car lover through and through!

Cats appear to have a seventh sense thanks to their whiskers and the very fine hairs on their paws which help them sense the slightest vibration. This means that they are aware of an impending disaster approx. 15 minutes before humans are able to detect any movement whatsoever.

Humming birds, these beautiful, tiny birds can fly backwards thanks to the fact that their wings only connect to their body from their flexible shoulder joint. Their wing beat is very rapid and rotates in the shape of a figure eight which enables them to fly backwards, side- ways and hover.

So who actually invented the bicycle? In 1817 Baron Karl Friedrich von Drals built a steerable balance bike out of wood and in 1869 Philipp Moritz Fischer added pedals. The Frenchman André Guilmet introduced the drive chain and by 1885 we had a bike as we know it, invented by the Englishman John Kemp Starley.
